

## **Davakis Report**

This report was completed by Lawrence Davakis of the Berlin office of the S.G.L.. Lawrence has spent the past twenty-one years researching the location of the remains of the Stavrosian ship. He took this assignment in 1995. The ship had been hidden by locals, buried beneath earth then covered over with small structures. It was believed that the ship was hidden so completely that it would never be found. This theory, however, has been changed by the work in the Davakis report, February 2021.

According to the report, the crash site and the subsequent burial of most of the ship had been discovered by Germans in 1943. This took place as German troops took control of the Dodecanese Island, from Ikaria to Crete, once known as the Italian Islands of the Aegean Sea. The German occupation of the region gave them the time and opportunity to excavate the site removing what they had found.

The report states that the findings were transported to Germany. The exact location of the excavated ship parts has not yet been discovered. The report suggests that much of the German findings were transported to Russia after the War. This was gathered from statements taken from German material handlers at that time.

Davakis found wartime correspondence written by General Ulrich Kleeman giving instructions to a crew of his men from his Assault Division to retrieve and crate the ship's remains. He advised them to accompany the shipment to Berlin. Captain Carl Munson was the Officer in charge of the detail. Davakis returned to Ikaria to try to find the crash site in 2016 - 2018. Davakis could not find any other remains or a probable location. What may still be there on the island was hidden with great skill.

Sometime after 1948 the orders to dig up and move the ship were lost to time. It was never given any clear discussion by the scientists after 1948. The Stavrosian Guard began a three-part effort to (1) Locate the ship's parts held by the Russian's. (2) Locate any remaining pieces of the ship that may have been left in Germany. (3) Strategically put out false and misleading information in an attempt to divert any curiosity. Their mission was to keep the secret. In those days no one was talking about Aliens from off planet. The most anyone had to talk about was foo fighters.

Lawrence began his work on the report at 86 years old. He submitted his work at their S.G.L. conference in Berlin, 2021. It was then sent to Georgia Wheaton, Head Librarian. G. Wheaton issued a summary report.

## Summary Report

After three years on IKARIA in search of the ship's remains, it has been declared by the S.G.L. Office of Records that debris from the ship has not been found, as per the Davakis report. Other possible locations have been searched for any physical evidence. It is still believed that American troops came across some of the ship's debris during the American occupation of Germany. Not knowing what they had, they would have turned it over to their superiors. What they found would have been sent to America. Their find may well be held at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Another location could be the site called Area 51.

Attempts to contact Russian officials in order to gain access to what they have has been met with an access refusal. They have not answered any further requests. It is, at this time, unadvised to contact anyone from the American government. The safety of the Stavrosian people is flameworked in anonymity.

The case of finding any of the ship's remains has been put on hold. The financial cost has become too large a burden to continue to absorb. The case is not closed, only on hold for the present. Future research will be based on credible evidence as well as available funds.
