Dr. Thomas Petsakies

In March of 1954 Doctor Thomas Petsakies met J. Robert Oppenheimer while attending a seminar at Princeton. Doctor Petsakies was a Stavrosian researcher looking for new technology. The hope of ever repairing the ship was long gone. Still men like Petsakies hoped to bring new ideas to the scientific community.

Oppenheimer was a promising source for an intellectual exchange of ideas. Robert Oppenheimer went to Princeton after he lost his security clearance from President Truman. Prior to that Robert was the Chairperson on the Atomic Energy Commission. His work on the Manhattan Project in 1941 brought him much acclaim. It was then in 1945 that he and the team were able to watch the first test of an Atomic bomb at Los Alamos.

Thomas and Robert spent many hours talking about what new technology would uncover next. On a warm July day 1947 Thomas told Robert about Stavros and the hybrid people. Robert was not as surprised as Thomas felt he would be. The two men discussed what could be done to share each other's technical knowledge.

The new Atomic era could have played a big part in helping the world. Sadly, its use is mostly military. There are some power plants used to create electric power. Not much more has been done with this knowledge. Thomas Petsakies had suggested that this form of power could be used to develop a man-made gravity field as a propulsion system on ships or even on aircraft.

Oppenheimer was open to this idea. He was working on how to make the technology applicable when he died in 1967. Doctor Petsakies passed away two years later in 1969. His hope of showing the world a future of endless energy died with him.

His children and grandchildren continue to work for energy generating corporations. Some just to name, General Electric , Con Ed., Tesla, Electricite de France, ENEL sPa Rome and E.on Germany .
