Courtesy Report
Romanian Jet Crash

Rodney, please pass this on to our friends. It is what we can do to share the information. Keep the lines of communication open between us and the people that have been of such help to us all.

On July 3, 2022, a Romanian fighter pilot was knocked out of the sky by a flying craft. Russian radar showed an unidentified blip. As it crossed over Romanian air space, several jets were sent to intercept and identify the craft. The jets separated so as to cover more area. One of the pilots tried to make radio contact and made several attempts, but received no response. The international warning was sent by the Russians followed by one from the Romanians. Still there was no response. Finally, the order was issued by the Russians to shoot down the craft that had violated Romanian air space. The Romanian government was reluctant at first but did comply.

The pilot radioed that he had a visual on the suspect craft and that it didn't look like anything he had ever seen. He told the tower he was actively moving into the attack position. That was the last radio contact that the Romanian tower received. After they lost contact, the Russians asked the Romanians to follow up with a search for the jet and missing pilot. The Russians would send support for the search.

For three days an aerial and ground search covered the area they lost contact in. The night of July 6, 2022 at 5:00 p.m, the Romanian jet crash site was located near the Moisna area. The jet was torn in half, its wings were completely missing. The Romanian pilot was also missing. Six more days were spent looking for the pilot. He was never found nor was any parachute ever located.

American radar from a Navy ship also recorded the flight of the unknown craft along with the Romanian jet. Their report went to a Navy command ship. They acted on it as a possible threat to general air travel. The navy had satellite coverage over the crash site. No other information was found to confirm the U.S. Naval involvement. The Russians have neither denied or confirmed their actions taken.

The event was reported from Romania on wide band radio. The story was picked up by the Polish news. This event was covered by Polish radio and TV. The S.G.L. found the story interesting and it was sent to G. Wheaton. She found it a curiosity and had it sent to the S.G.L. Library.

The story has been recorded and passed on to UFO groups as a courtesy for all their help.
